For those amongst us who were able to attend the Year 4 Chapel Service on Thursday we were able to see first-hand how classroom learning links to their lives. Through the Central Idea of 'The way people manage relationships can have positive and negative effects,' Year 4 children have considered behaviour, choices and rights, and responsibilities.

Teachers across the school have worked alongside children facilitating opportunities for them to show attitudes of respect, tolerance and cooperation. Importantly, learning in this Unit of Inquiry has allowed these children to engage in reflection as a way to develop their understanding of responsibilities surrounding relationships.

As adults, our modelling of relationships is vital. Teaching children that sometimes being a good friend can be difficult is important, remembering within good friendships the rewards far outweigh the challenges. A good place to start is with a simple smile.

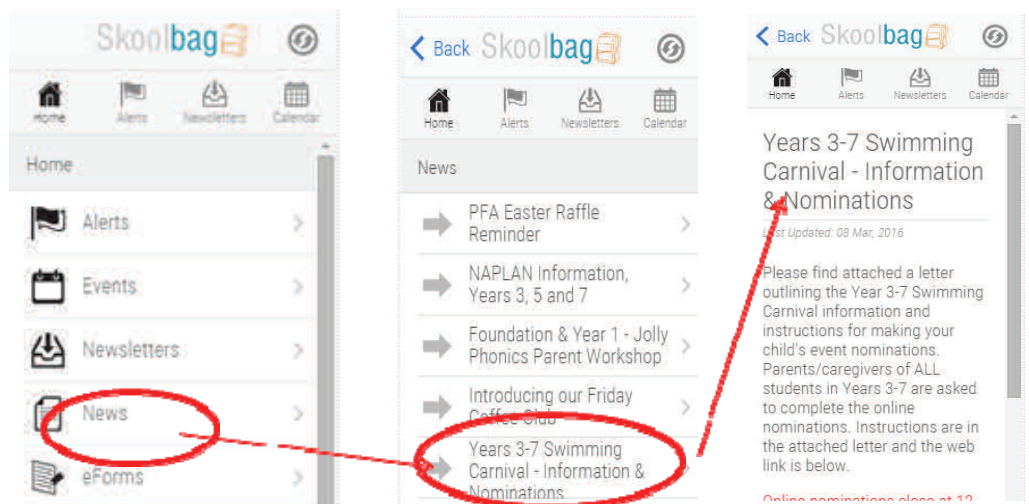


Years 3 to 7 Swimming Carnival
