From the Principal

In our current Strategic Plan 2015-2019, we highlight our School of the Future, recognising that our students, on leaving school, will live, study and work in a vastly different and ever evolving world. Therefore, with the Strategic Plan in mind, I was reminded of the exciting times ahead when I read an article called "The Future of Work". "More than half of all current Australian students are training for jobs that will not exist in the future, all that will be transformed by automation, according to a new report by the Foundation for Young Australians.

- * 44% of jobs will be automated in the next 10 years
- * 60% of students are chasing careers that won't exist
- * Young people will have an average of 17 different jobs during their working life."

It is therefore clear that young people need to be prepared for a working life that may be vastly different to mine.

"Making sure new jobs outnumber those being eliminated requires creating a work force able to service high-skilled positions that technology is unlikely to take over. The skills employers most want from staff are digital know-how, management, creativity, entrepreneurship, and problem solving. We need to be educating people with these skills as well as with the basic broad based skills of working hard and being able to work well with others."

This is a timely reminder that puts schools under a challenging light.

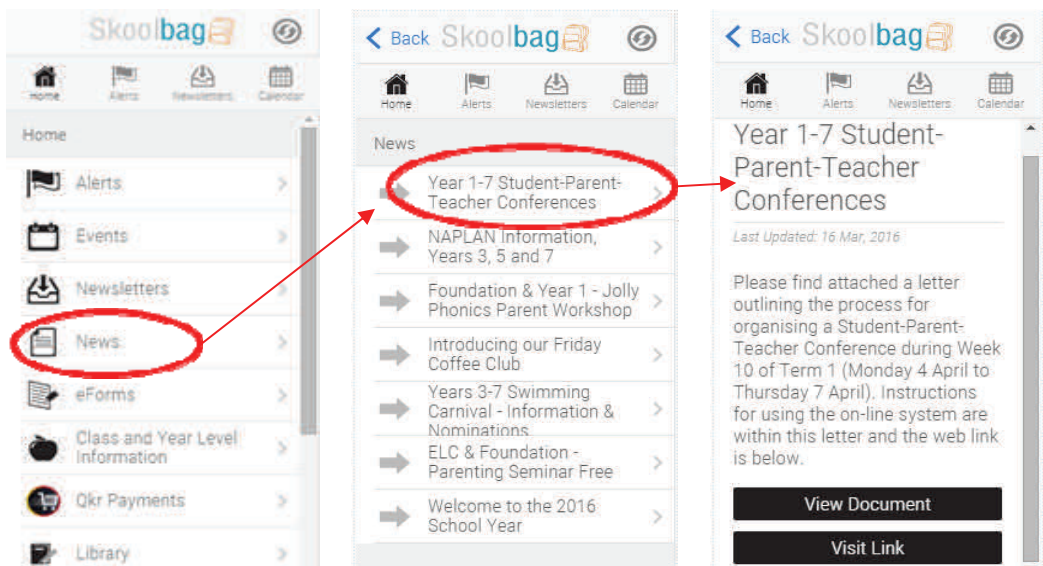
Student-Parent-Teacher Conferences for students in Year 1 to Year 7 are being held from Monday 4 April to Thursday 7 April 2016.

Save time with repeat orders (food orders only)

Did you know that you can save time by copying food orders from a previous week within the calendar view? This is a handy way to save time and quickly re-order your child's favourite lunch orders. Simply:

- 1 Sign in to your *Qkr!*™ account and Tap on 'Canteen'
- 2 Tap on the downward arrow icon to the right of the calendar screen. You will be asked if you wish to copy your orders from the previous week to the current week
- 3 Tap 'Yes'
- 4 Once you have copied last week's orders to your cart, you can make edits by tapping on a particular date. This allows you the flexibility to amend your copied order for a particular day or for a specific child
