From the Principal

Many of you would be aware that the place of Year 7s in Primary Schools in South Australia has been a topic of conversation for some years. Currently South Australia is the only State and Territory in Australia that continues to allow Year 7s to remain in Primary School.

We are aware that some schools and indeed some schooling systems have moved or are contemplating moving their Year 7s into different schooling arrangements. I am not aware of any concrete plans for DECD schools to move Year 7s onto Secondary School campuses in the near future.

Our enrolments at Year 6 and 7 are at an all-time high and long may that continue. We believe that our solid enrolment base in the Year 6-7 Centre is the direct result of an outstanding curriculum specifically developed for emerging adolescents, along with outstanding pastoral care, flexible 21st Century learning spaces and a hand-chosen and committed teaching staff. This coupled with the increased ability to build leadership capacity amongst the older students, with the opportunity to celebrate an important "finishing Primary School" milestone, are attractive propositions.

Should the government decide to move Year 7s into Secondary Schools, we would have a difficult decision to make, however our plans have always been to provide the Year 7 offering, so long as there is a strong demand for Year 7 at SPW.

As always, if any parent/caregiver wishes to discuss their child's continuing education at SPW, or their entrance into Secondary School, I would be only too happy to meet with you.

Vacancy: PFA Appointed Member to School Council

There is a current vacancy on the SPW School Council as a result of the resignation of PFA Appointed Member, Mrs Deb Disbury. The vacancy is until the end of the 2017 school year. The successful nominee can seek a further 3 year term at the end of 2017. The PFA Nominee to School Council must be a current parent of a student enrolled at SPW.

Public notice of intention to elect a PFA nominee to School Council is 28 days. Therefore, current parents who wish to nominate will be required to put their vitae forward to School Council **by Monday 27 March 2017** for vetting by School Council prior to name/names being forwarded to the PFA. The vitaes, addressed to Cathy Mayfield, Chairman of School Council, can be either handed to Helen Lindquist, marked CONFIDENTIAL, or emailed to Helen.

Suitable candidates as decided by School Council will need to present to a Committee meeting or special general meeting of the PFA, at which time a secret ballot will be held if there is more than one nomination. The person receiving the highest number of votes will be the nominee of the PFA. If there is only one nominee that has been approved by the School Council, the PFA are still required to approve that nomination at a Committee meeting or a specially convened PFA meeting. As School Council only meets twice per term, it is most likely the election process will take place on Wednesday 7 June.
