Objectives

Our Faith in Practice

We embed Faith in every aspect of the school, it is threaded through the core day as well as given explicit focus.

Chapel Worship

Each week Chapel worship takes place in a variety of ways. Parents and caregivers are always welcome to attend. During the year, each year level presents a Chapel service connecting their classroom learning with a spiritual theme. Other regular services include communion, chaplain-led services, chapel-choir services, guest speaker services and staff-presented services. Occasionally sub-schools will have their own

chapel service, and on those days other year levels will either meet in the Piltangka Plaza or in their classrooms for Chapel. As an Anglican school, students and their families also have access, if they desire, to rites of passage such as Baptism, Admission to Communion (offered in Year 3), Confirmation (offered in Year 6) as well as weddings and funerals for extended community members.
